



Sightings Record Mediterranean Odyssey

As the Chair of Trustees of the Sea Watch Foundation it is my great pleasure to share with you the sightings throughout this Viking Star cruise, from Barcelona to Venice, along with a few of the photographs I have taken, with thanks to the passengers who submitted reports.

Sea Watch Foundation is the leading UK cetacean research charity and has been collecting sightings data since the 1970s to create Europe's biggest whale, dolphin and porpoise sightings database. This is used to inform EU and national governments, scientific and environmental agencies and NGOs, as well as independent research scientists who have an interest in studying and protecting cetaceans and the marine environment.

08/10/17 Barcelona, Spain (or Catalonia?)

Lots of Gulls around the harbour, Mainly Yellow-legged and Mediterranean. There were no sightings during sail-away, except more gulls.

09/10/17 Toulon, France

- AM No sightings as we sailed into port, except a few more gulls.
- 1913 2+ Dolphins, possibly Striped, leaping in to starboard bow

10/10/17 Monte Carlo, Monaco, at anchor

A few Cormorants and Yellow-legged Gulls in and around the harbour and during sail-in and sail-away

11/10/17 Livorno, Italy

A whale was heard surfacing strongly and then seen surfacing again by Elton Reid, shortly after we left the outer breakwater. The species is uncertain but from his description it may have been a Minke Whale.

12/10/17 Civitaveccia, Italy

Yellow-legged and Mediterranean Gulls in and around the harbour

13/10/17 Naples, Italy

- 0845 Feeding frenzy of Tuna and Gulls with lots of smaller fish, 200yds off port bow
- 0918 8+ Dolphins, probably Bottlenose, in to starboard bow, very brief sighting Lots of Yellow-legged and Mediterranean Gulls as well as a couple of Shearwaters

2050-2105 Hundreds, maybe 1000+, mainly Yellow-legged Gulls all around the ship and in the wake, riding air currents and picking small silver fish from the surface. An awesome sight and sound!

14/10/17 At Sea, Tyrrhenian Sea, Strait of Messina, Ionian Sea

- 0842 6+ Striped Dolphins, in to port bow and alongside. Mum and calf spotted in surf!
- 0844 Splashing seen twice, 2 miles to port. Possibly Dolphins or alternatively large fish such as Tuna
- 0847 Airborne Striped Dolphin close off the starboard bow
- 0856 Striped Dolphin leaping in to starboard bow
- 0859 2 Striped Dolphins leaping in to port bow
- 0904 2 Striped Dolphins to port, side leaping in the waves of the bow wake
- 1119 12+ Striped Dolphins leaping in to port bow, then in the port bow wake
- 1213 Dolphins 2-3miles to port, species unidentified, apparently feeding
- 1354 Loggerhead Turtle, 3-4ft long, photographed close to port side
- 1408 8+Dolphins, species unidentified, feeding 1¹/₂ miles to port
- 1413 Splashes to starboard, possibly Dolphins, maybe large fish such as Tuna
- 1414 Loggerhead Turtle to port, maybe 3ft long
- 1430 Small Loggerhead Turtle to port, maybe 2-3ft long
- 1435 Very small Loggerhead Turtle, 1-2ft long, photographed by Kris to starboard
- 1443 Dolphins, species unidentified, 2 miles to port
- 1620 Dolphins spotted leaping off to port by a passenger A Robin and a Chaffinch have also been spotted around the ship!

15/10/17 Corfu, Greece

Only a few Gulls and Cormorants as we sailed away

16/10/17 Dubrovnik, Croatia

Only a few Gulls during sail-in and sail-away

17/10/17 Split, Croatia

Rays spotted by a passenger, along the shore aft

- 1901 3 Bottlenose Dolphins, then 2 more, 1 mile to starboard
- 1902 5+ Bottlenose Dolphins, apparently feeding, 1 mile off starboard bow
- 1904 6 Bottlenose Dolphins, surging to starboard bow, then surfing in the starboard bow wake, aft
